## Vikings remain perfect in league

This time, Lake-Sumter State College played much better on its home court than it did three weeks ago.

The result was still a loss. And the wins keep rolling up for the St. Johns River State College volleyball team.

Louisa Marunde put down 12 kills, had three blocks and a service ace, while Lucy Herter and Brooklyn McLeod each put up 11 kills in leading the Vikings to a 25-16, 20-25, 25-16, 25-19 Sun-Lakes Conference triumph over the LakeHawks Wednesday.

The wins kept the Vikings unbeaten and on top of the conference standings at 6-0, while improving them overall to 16-5. They have won 12 of their last 13 matches.

"We started out fast and felt pretty good about how we did," Vikings coach Matt Cohen said. "Then we got up 15-11 in the second set and got stuck in a rotation we couldn't get out of and ended up in a rut. It went from us being up 15-11 to being down 20-15. But we responded much better in the third set and ended up getting out to a quick start before winning by six (points) in the fourth set. It was a very good effort by our girls."

Herter added 14 digs and McLeod had a service ace. Kendal Hoges had eight kills and four blocks, Dariana Luna came up with 24 digs and Jordyn Pruski was her consistent self at setter with 39 assists and 17 digs. The Vikings had 83 digs overall in the match.

They return to the court tonight to face South Carolina-Salkehatchie at Tuten Gymnasium before traveling to Avon Park to play Sun-Lakes rival South Florida at 3 p.m. Friday.
