Reporting for Coronavirus Response & Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) & American
Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)
Student Emergency Aid Grants to Students

1. St. Johns River State College (SJR State) acknowledges that has signed and returned the Certification of Agreement for CRRSAA and ARPA student emergency grant funds. The institution will use the amount of funds designated under Section 314(a)(1) to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
2. St. Johns River State College has received \$7,278,643 for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students pursuant to the Certification and Agreement under CRRSAA (\$1,498,969) and ARPA (\$5,779,674).
3. As of June 30, 2021, St. Johns River State College has distributed \$1,498,969 in Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under CRRSAA.
4. In Spring 2021, there were 1,012 students at SJR State eligible to receive emergency financial aid grants to students.
5. As of June 30, 2021, 1,012 students at SJR State received emergency financial aid grants. Additional dollars were supplied by institutional funds under CRRSAA (a)(1).
6. SJR State utilized the following guidelines to determine student eligibility: 1) the requirements of Section 314(a)(1) of CRRSAA, and 2) guidance provided by the U.S. Department of Education for the Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Based on these requirements and guidelines, the College established eligibility criteria.

- Be enrolled in a degree or certificate program at SJR State
- Be a U.S. Citizen or eligible noncitizen
- Have an error-free, verified 2020-2021 free application for federal student aid (FAFSA)
- Be Pell eligible
- Have not previously received an emergency maximum CARES HEERF I funding from SJR State
- Not be dual enrolled

Student eligibility requirements were gathered using information in the College's Student Information System. Students that met minimum eligibility were reviewed and manually examined to ensure eligibility.

At St. Johns River State College, students received a flat award amount of \$1500. The amount was set at \$1500 to provide significant support across the population estimated to be eligible and to facilitate a timely distribution of the funds to students.
